■ Day 1: Australia to Chennai

Fly with Singapore Airlines to Chennai for a three-night stay. ■ Day 2: Chennai

Enjoy a city tour of Chennai, the former British trading post previously known as Madras. See Marina Beach, the second longest beach in the world and visit Fort St. George and St. Mary's Church, Later this afternoon continue to the Kapaleeswarar Temple in

■ Day 3: Temples of Kanchipuram & Mamallapuram

Mylapore, which is dedicated to

Lord Shiva, 'the destroyer'.

This morning travel to Kanchipuram and visit a number of local temples. Continue to the 7th-century port city of Mamallapuram. Discover the rock-cut temples, including the Shore Temple, and see recently discovered archaeological excavations and artefacts. The Shore Temple stands elegantly overlooking the sea, illustrating the beauty of Pallava. It is small in size but has high quality carvings. Built in the 8th century, it's the earliest significant free-standing stone temple in Tamil Nadu. Return to Chennai this afternoon.

■ Day 4: Train to Bangalore Rise early this morning and catch

the Shatabdi Express train to Bangalore, often referred to as south India's 'garden city'. Tour the city, including a visit to the Bull Temple and Vidhana Soudha (Legislature Building). The Bull Temple is dedicated to Nandi Bull, the vehicle of Lord Shiva and is among the oldest temples in the city. The idol of Nandi Bull is said to have been carved out of a single rock.

Hassan where you will explore the

Sravanabelagola Temple and have the opportunity to climb to the top. Continue to the famous temples of Belur and Halebid. The Belur temples are some of the finest examples of Hoysala workmanship.

■ Day 5: Temples of Hassan

This morning, head west to

■ Day 6: Discover Mysore

Travel south to Mysore, stopping en route at Srirangapatna Fort. Later, visit the Maharaja's Palace and drive up to Chamundi Hill, where you will see the Sri Chamundeshwari Temple and the Nandi Bull Statue. Tonight enjoy a traditional cooking demonstration hosted by a local family.

■ Day 7: Coonoor Hillstation Head to the hills and drive to Coonoor. Located at an altitude

of 1.850 metres above sea level, Coonoor is the second largest hillstation in the Nilgiri Hills. The evening is at your leisure to relax or take an optional walk around the hillstation.

■ Day 8: Toy Train to Ooty

This morning take the Toy Train to the hillstation of Ooty where you will visit the botanical gardens. Ooty is affectionately known as the 'Queen of the Hillstations'. It is picturesque, green and home to coffee and tea plantations. You may wish to take a walk to a nearby village to gain an insight into the lives of the local people before returning to Coonoor.

■ Day 9: Travel to Munnar

Continue the descent from the highlands as you travel to Munnar. the favoured summer resort of British rulers in the colonial days. Endless tea plantations. untouched valleys and mountains are to be found here.

■ Day 10: Discover Munnar

Travel to Mattupetty Dam and enjoy an easy walk around the lakeside areas. Depending on the time of year, continue to Eravikulam National Park where you will have the opportunity to explore the area and spot some of the wildlife. In the afternoon, visit a local tea plantation and the Tata Tea Museum. Eravikulam National Park is closed Feb – Apr each year and alternative touring will be available. Ask reservations for details.

■ Day 11: Travel to Thekkady

Drive to Thekkady, home of Perivar National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary. This afternoon visit a local spice village and browse a local market in Thekkady.

■ Day 12: Periyar National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary

Set high in the ranges of the Western Ghats, Periyar National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary is home to great scenic beauty and rich biodiversity. Take an early morning walk through the sanctuary where you might spot an elephant or an elusive tiger. This evening watch a Kalaripayattu performance, a traditional form of martial arts.

■ Day 13: Kerala backwaters

Drive to Kumarakom to board your overnight houseboat. The houseboats are converted from traditional rice barges and are known as 'kettuvallams'. Enjoy the enchanting waters and panoramic views of rural life along the banks, passing ancient Chinese fishing nets, lush rice paddies, local villages, temples and coconut groves. Enjoy a dinner of traditional Keralan cuisine.

■ Day 14: Journey to Kochi Disembark your houseboat in Pallathururuthy and drive to Kochi. Stop en route at a local market and coir factory. Later, visit Kumbalangi Integrated Tourism Village, built to highlight the

fisher-folk way of life in the region.

■ Day 15: Explore Kochi

Tour the sites of Kochi starting with a visit to St. Francis Church and the Santa Cruz Basilica. Visit the historic Jewish Synagogue, local markets and see the unique cantilevered Chinese fishing nets. This evening watch a traditional Kathakali dance performance.

■ Day 16: Depart Kochi

Enjoy a free morning to spend at your leisure. After a late checkout, you will be transferred to Kochi airport to board your overnight flight to Australia.






■ Day 1: Australia to Delhi Fly with Singapore Airlines to Delhi for an overnight stay.

■ Day 2: Taj Mahal

Travel to Agra by train and tour the city, visiting the 17th-century Itmad-Ud-Daulah, nicknamed the 'Baby Taj' and the colossal Agra Fort. The day concludes before the magnificent Taj Mahal, which you will get to see as evening sets in. Watching the colours of the sunset playing across the mausoleum's white marble is an enchanting experience.

Frequently Asked Questions About **Travelling to Bhutan**

Q. What is the dress code when travelling in Bhutan?

A. Bhutanese people are conservative in their thinking and every visitor to Bhutan should respect this. Please avoid wearing tight revealing clothing and sleeveless T-shirts while visiting public areas. Please wear long pants and sleeved T-shirts and carry a spare pair of socks (for temple visits). While at Paro Dzong (Ta Dzong), men are asked to wear a collared shirt.

Q. Can I smoke in Bhutan?

A. Yes, provided you obey the rules regarding tobacco products in Bhutan. Respect religious monuments and refrain from smoking in confined private places. All foreign travellers are required to declare all tobacco products upon arrival in Bhutan, whether it is at a border crossing or at the airport. You will be required to pay a 200% tax at this time. You will be provided with a receipt and are expected to carry it at all times. If these rules are not followed, harsh penalties and imprisonment may apply.

Q. How do I behave at monasteries, temples and dzongs?

A. Always walk in a clockwise direction while visiting religious places or objects; it is always a good idea to watch the local people to see what the right behaviour is. Do not point a finger at any sacred object. Please do not take pictures inside a monastery, temple, dzong or government establishments. Please always ask for permission before taking a photo of an adult or child.

Q. What kind of vehicles will I travel in?

A. A mid-range car is used when touring with 1-2 passengers, and a mini-van is used when touring with 3-6 passengers. For group tours, a Toyota Coaster mini-coach is used for 7-12 passengers. All vehicles are meticulously maintained and safety checked. Coaches do not have bathroom facilities or seatbelts.

Q. Is English widely-spoken?

A. Yes, English is widely-spoken in Bhutan.

Q. Are tourist sites open everyday in Bhutan?

A. Many tourist sites (including religious sites) are often closed during the weekend and on government holidays. Please check with our reservations department to determine if your travel dates will be affected.

Q. What kind of food is available?

A. Bhutanese cuisine consists of steamed rice (red or white) served with spicy curries and can be vegetarian and non-vegetarian. Most hotels offer buffet-style meals including Continental, Chinese and Bhutanese food. All hotels and restaurants have a selection of international and Bhutanese drinks. Vegetarians will have plenty of ontions in Rhutan

Q. Is there any other important health information?

A. The roads in Bhutan wind around mountains and through valleys, so it is common for travellers to experience motion sickness. If you suffer from motion sickness, please bring preventative medicine. If you are travelling to Punakha and Bumthang, you will encounter high altitude.

Please consult a doctor before travelling to discuss your physical health. You should always carry prescription medicines with necessary doctor's notes and prescriptions when travelling.

Permit Requirements and Procedure

All travellers to Bhutan require a permit to enter this unique kingdom. Wendy Wu Tours' group tours and independent packages visiting Bhutan are inclusive of the cost of this permit.

In order to process this, we require a clear colour photocopy of your passport bio page no less than 60 days prior to your date of entry into Bhutan. Please ensure your passport has at least six months validity left from your arrival date back into Australia

Once processed, our partners in Bhutan will send the Bhutan visa document to our office and it will be included in your travel documents. This is not your permit; it is just a document showing you have applied for one. The actual permit will be stamped into your passport upon arrival in Bhutan, either overland or at Paro airport.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If you are travelling from India, you will require a multiple-entry visa to return to India from Bhutan. Wendy Wu Tours can also assist you with your India visa application at your request.






