Experience Notre Dame Cathedral and the neoclassical Central Post Office, designed by Gustave Eiffel – both grandiose legacies of a colonial past. Also visit the Reunification Palace and the chilling War Remnants Museum where the brutality of the war and its victims are well-documented

■ Day 7: Mekong Delta

Journey to Ben Tre to take a cruise on the mighty Mekong. This area is known as the 'Rice Basket of Vietnam', the rich and fertile lands producing huge amounts of rice, coconuts, vegetables and tropical fruits. JOINING YOUR TOUR

For tours flying with Vietnam Airlines, passengers from Brisbane, Adelaide and Canberra will fly to either Sydney or Melbourne with QANTAS Airways or Virgin Australia before travelling onwards to Vietnam with Vietnam Airlines. These domestic flights are included in the cost of your tour. When flying with Vietnam Airlines your international flight to and from Hanoi and Siem Reap are via Saigon

Passengers travelling from Perth, Darwin and Cairns will fly with Singapore Airlines and SilkAir due to better flight connections.

For tours flying with QANTAS Airways, passengers from Adelaide may require an overnight stop in Sydney (at their own expense) due to flight schedules.

Limited flight schedules out of Darwin mean that on some tours, Darwin passengers will need to make their own way to another capital city to join the tour.

For tours flying with Singapore Airlines, Adelaide passengers may wish to fly into/ out of Melbourne at their own expense to avoid an overnight stop in Singapore.

YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

THE BOOKING PROCESS

Q. When will my booking be confirmed?

A. Once we receive your deposit, your place on tour will be confirmed. We will also confirm any additional arrangements such as pre and post-tour accommodation. This usually takes 3-5 days and can vary depending on the destination and if there are any holiday periods. We will then send you an updated invoice showing your deposit payment, along with a Visa Application Form and Medical Information Form to be completed (if appropriate). These forms can also be accessed via our website. Passenger names must be provided exactly as per passport at the time of booking.

Q. Where do I find more details about my tour?

A. You can access detailed information about your tour and travel destinations on our website at www.wendywutours.com.au/ pre-departure-info. It is essential that you read the relevant Tour Dossier prior to booking. If there are any particular challenges such as the length of time spent on your feet. journey times or accommodation standards, they will be explained in the Tour Dossier. If you cannot access our website, please phone us and we will send the information to you.

Q. Can special requests be arranged?

A. We will do our best to accommodate your special request. Please advise us of any medical requirements, special meal requests, special needs, or mobility impairment at time of booking.

Q. What do I need to know about your NEW group tours?

A. Wendy Wu Tours is proud to present some new tour options in 2017. While we have carefully researched the itineraries, this is the first time these tours have operated and it should be remembered that unforeseen changes or surprises may occur. Although these unexpected occurrences may add to the enjoyment of the tour, if this is a concern for you, we suggest waiting until a later departure before travelling with us on your selected tour.

Q. When will I receive my tour documentation?

A. Two weeks before you travel you will receive your final documentation, including a detailed day-by-day itinerary, hotel list, travel guide and phrasebook, as well as a suggested packing list. You will also receive your passport back, complete with the relevant visas.

Q. When should I arrange travel insurance?

A. It is strongly recommended that you are adequately covered by insurance for the duration of your travel arrangements. We recommend that you take out a policy as soon as you pay your deposit. For advice from the Australian Government regarding travel insurance, please visit http://smartraveller. gov.au/guide/all-travellers/insurance. We can arrange a policy for you or you can choose your own. Please phone us or contact your travel agent for further information.

Q. Which hotels are used by Wendy Wu Tours?

A. Hotel details will be sent with your final documentation. Note that these may be subject to change. Accommodation is generally 3-4 star standard. In some remote areas, accommodation may be of a lower standard and may not have all Western amenities. Rest assured that all hotels used by Wendy Wu Tours are regularly inspected by our staff and our partners to ensure they will meet your needs. See pages 112-113 for examples of hotels we usually use.

Q. Do I need a visa?

A. Fully Inclusive Classic Tours. Discovery and Deluxe Group Tours:

Visas are required for most of Wendy Wu Tours' destinations. Visa fees are included in your tour price for our Fully Inclusive Classic Tours, Discovery Tours and Deluxe Tours for

Australian passport holders. Additional fees may apply for non-Australian passport holders.

For Land Only bookings, visas are not included but can be arranged for an additional fee please ask at time of booking.

All passports must be valid for at least six months beyond the duration of your tour and should be sent to Wendy Wu Tours along with your visa application forms at least 60 days prior to departure. Some visas take longer to process (Myanmar and multi-country tours take 90 days) and we will notify you of this at the time of booking. We will submit your passport and visa application to the relevant consulate on your behalf for processing. Your passport will be returned to you with your final documentation approximately two weeks prior

Independent travel:

If you are travelling on one of our Independent Private Tours, visa fees are not included in your tour cost and it is your responsibility to arrange all necessary visas.

HEALTH & TOUR GRADINGS

Q. Are there any health precautions or vaccinations that I need?

A. We recommend you see your doctor at least six weeks prior to travel for advice and to allow time for any necessary vaccinations. Please remember to take your Tour Dossier with you.

Q. How fit do I need to be?

A. We want you to have the best tour experience possible, so you should be in reasonably good health and be able to participate in all activities unaided. Some of our itineraries include difficult conditions which can make physical activities challenging.

Each group tour is graded to reflect the level of fitness required to assist you in making the best choice. You can also find detailed information in each Tour Dossier. available on our website.

Comfortable

Accessible to most people with an average level of fitness and average mobility. These tours may involve sightseeing on foot, some climbing of stairs and getting on and off boats.

Moderate

Not strenuous, but these tours require a higher level of fitness and may include climbing of stairs and getting on and off boats as well as longer periods of sightseeing on foot/driving. Easy walking, areas of high altitude and overnight train journeys may feature.

Require a good level of fitness, as these tours are physically more demanding. In addition to activities featured in the comfortable and moderate tours, they may also involve hiking, and some travel to remote, high altitude areas where tourist facilities are less developed.

If you are unsure about the suitability of a particular itinerary, please contact us for advice. Our range of private tours and independent travel are more flexible and may better cater for individual needs. Please contact us if you require any advice.

TRANSPORTATION

Q. What sort of transport do you use?

The modes of transport included in our tours have been chosen with variety, comfort and enjoyment in mind. On tour, you may travel by coach, boat, trains, plane and even rickshaw, all of which will give you a unique Asia travel experience.



International flights: All of our Fully Inclusive Classic Tours, Discovery and Deluxe Group Tours include international flights. Due to varied flight schedules, some tours may include overnight flights, and some passengers may arrive or depart on different days of the tour.

Domestic flights: Internal flights on tour are based on economy class with reputable airlines. Please note that flight schedules, delays and stopovers are outside of the control of Wendy Wu Tours, however we will do our best to ensure the smooth running of your tour in case of any delays.



Road: All coach travel is in comfortable, air conditioned vehicles. Generally there are no toilets on board the coaches; however we take comfort stops when possible.



Boats: Some tours include a cruise as part of the sightseeing. Depending on the location, the type and size of the boat used will vary. Tours which have an overnight stay on Halong Bay will include accommodation in twin share Cabins with a private en suite.



Rail: All overnight train journeys are first class, using four berth, soft sleeper cabins (excluding Thailand, where second class is used). Due to booking regulations, sole use of overnight sleeper compartments is not available during our Treasures of Vietnam & China tour. We will always endeavour to keep group members together in the same compartment; however, there may be times where this is not possible. In these circumstances, you may find yourself sharing with other travellers. Shared cabins may combine male and female travellers. Facilities on board are basic with both western and Asian-style toilets. A 2nd-class soft seat is booked for daytime journeys by train. There is limited space for storing luggage. While our guides are there to assist, you will need to load and unload your own luggage on and off the train. Day trains only stop for several minutes at each stop, so you must be ready to leave the train when your guide instructs.

ON TOUR

Q. Will I have a guide?

A. Group Tours: Every group tour that has 10 or more passengers travelling will be accompanied by a National Escort from the moment you exit the airport, to when you depart. On multi-country tours, a different National Escort is used in each country. Extensions and stopovers are not accompanied by a National Escort; however you will have the benefit of our knowledgeable Local Guides. Transfers and flights to and from optional extension destinations are not escorted.

Independent Travel: Private tours are not accompanied by a National Escort, but will be accompanied by knowledgeable Local Guides in each location.

Please see pages 10-11 for further information on our guides.

Q. Do you run guaranteed departures?

A. All tours are guaranteed at the listed price operating with a National Escort, providing a minimum of 10 travellers are booked to travel on that departure.

Q. Who will be in my group?

A. Your group will be made up of travellers from diverse backgrounds and will be varied in age. Our groups generally mix well due to a shared interest in travel and eagerness to explore all that Asia has to offer.

Q. I am a solo traveller - do I have to pay a single supplement?

A. At Wendy Wu Tours we understand that some solo travellers would happily share a room on tour to avoid paying an additional supplement. If you are a solo traveller who is willing to share, and you book outside of 75 days prior to departure, Wendy Wu Tours will match you up with another solo traveller of the same gender on your tour and neither of you will pay the Single Hotel Room Option. If we are unable to find another solo traveller who is willing to share, we will waive the Single Hotel Room Option. If you are a solo traveller and prefer to have a private room during your group tour, you can pay a Single Hotel Room Option. This covers hotel nights only. Separate supplements apply for rail and cruise nights. Please contact us for further details.

**Halong Bay Cruise Boats: On some of our Vietnam tours there are cruises on Halong Bay. If you are willing to share a cabin, you will initially need to pay a Single Cruise Cabin Option, which is then refunded if you are matched up with another Wendy Wu Tours customer. The cabin allocation will be communally based and you may be matched up with a passenger from another group or of the opposite gender if there are other passengers on board. If there are no other passengers who are willing to share, the Single Cruise Cabin Option you have paid will cover sole use of a twin cabin.

**Deluxe Tours: Please note willing to share is not available on our Deluxe Tours and a Single Supplement applies for all solo travellers.

Q. When is the best time to visit Indochina?

A Indochina is a year-round destination and the climate varies from north to south. Please refer to our website for detailed climate information for each country.

Q. When are the public holidays

A. Lunar New Year Festival (Vietnam) runs from 27th January to 31st January 2017. Laos New Year (Laos) runs from 14th April to 16th April 2017. Khmer New Year (Cambodia) runs from 13th April to 17th April 2017. Celebrations last for several days and during this time some businesses will be closed.

Q. What should I expect when travelling in Asia?

A. We plan our tours to ensure that your holiday is safe and trouble free and we are continually working with our local partners to maintain and improve health and safety standards. Overseas travel brings new experiences and varied environments and sometimes this means different safety and hygiene standards to those we are used to in Australia. We therefore ask that you take care; pay attention at all times and use your common sense. You are also requested to refer to notices and follow advice from your National Escort or Local Guide.

ON TOUR

Q. Do you allow children on your tours?

A. We allow children 12 years and over on our group tours. For families travelling with children, our Private Tours or Independent Travel packages offer greater flexibility and are suitable for any age group.

Q. What is the daily tour schedule?

A. Timings vary from group to group and are dependent on local conditions. Your guide will provide you with daily updates.

Q. Are meals included?

A. On our Fully Inclusive Classic Group Tours, all meals (excluding beverages) are included unless specifically stated otherwise. Discovering new cuisine is a highlight of travel to Asia and your Local Guide will give you tips on local specialities to try. You will sample a range of local cuisine with occasional western meals, and meals are usually taken at local restaurants. In remote areas, some meals may be basic or repetitive.

On Independent Private Tours, Discovery Tours and Deluxe Tours, some meals are included however we have also included several free evenings, offering flexibility for those who wish to explore local restaurants. Please check your day-by-day tour itinerary for details of which meals are included. B = Breakfast,

L = Lunch, D = Dinner.

Q. Is Tipping Compulsory?

A. Tipping is a firm and expected element in the tourism industry in Asia. Due to pricing regulations in Australia, a nominated tipping amount is included in all group tour pricing, however it is not collected in your final payment received by Wendy Wu Tours. This is so that it can be paid directly to your National Escort who will then distribute the tips among your main service providers – guides and drivers – on your behalf.

Any other tipping, such as tips for bathroom attendants, hotel porters or river guides is at your discretion based on satisfaction of services received, as are gratuities for requested additional services. For tours which include a Pandaw or Lernidee River cruise, tipping will need to be paid in US Dollars directly to the crew. The final tipping amounts in each currency will be outlined in your final documentation.

Q. Are there any optional excursions?

A. All excursions on our Indochina group tours are included.

Q. Are there shopping opportunities on tour?

A. Indochina has an array of shopping opportunities for those who love to seek out a bargain; from hand-carved marble statues in Danang, woven products in Inle Lake and gold leaf designs in Mandalay. We encourage all passengers to enjoy their local shopping expeditions but to take care and be wise when purchasing.

Hanoi

Situated in the north of Vietnam, Hanoi experiences cold and dry winters and hot and humid summers. Spring and autumn are the most ideal times to visit with warmer temperatures and lower humidity.

Saigon

Tropical Saigon is usually warm all year round and dry during the winter and spring months. Popular times to visit are October to December. Saigon's rainy season falls in the summer months, but these rain spells often clear quickly.

Hoi An

Hoi An has two distinct seasons. Summer is very dry and warm, making this the ideal time to visit. Winter months are cooler with heavier rainfall. Hoi An's tropical climate still make this stunning city warm year round.

Siem Reap

Siem Reap is warm throughout the year. From May to October Siem Reap has its highest rainfall, but temperatures still remain warm. October to April is when Siem Reap is at its driest period.

Luang Prabang

Luang Prabang is located along the Mekong River and has two typical seasons. During the winter months Luang Prabang is hot and dry and during the summer months it is warm but with higher rainfall than the winter months.

Bangkok

With its typical tropical climate, Bangkok is warm year round and at its hottest between March and June. Humidity levels are higher during this time, but this vibrant city cools down a little between July and October with occasional showers.


