GENERAL INFO

DAILY TOURING

These tours are designed for those who wish to see the iconic sites and magnificent treasures of Hainan Island on a private tour. You will be accompanied by our dedicated local guides, whose unparalleled knowledge will turn your holiday into an unforgettable experience.

TRANSPORT

Cars: cars with air conditioning are used on our tours for city sightseeing, short excursions to the countryside and longer transfers where necessary. Roads in China have generally improved over recent years, but traffic and/or weather conditions may extend driving times. Road construction work usually covers an enormous section of road - not just 1-2 kilometres as you may be used to. For this reason, the timings listed in the itinerary are approximations only. There may be sections of road where the surface is comparatively bumpy, but our drivers will do their utmost to lessen the impact.

Trains: Bullet trains are a great way to travel around China whether you're in second, first or business class. The rail times cannot be confirmed until 30 days prior to departure, however we can provide estimated departure times and duration. Please let your travel specialist know if you have preferred times to depart. A passport copy Is required to confirm rail journeys.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Please ensure that all names provided are as they appear on your passport, as name changes or amendments may incur fees. It is your responsibility to ensure you have a valid passport and all visas required for your holiday. We cannot process the visa within 30 days prior to departure. Wendy Wu Tours provides a visa service for Australian passport holders only. Entry visas are required by all visitors to China and not included in the tour cost. Wendy Wu Tours' Visa Department can assist you with the process of obtaining a visa. We will supply you with all paperwork and submit the visa application on your behalf. Visas for China are valid for 90 days from the date of issue and allow you to stay in the country for up to 30 days. Please be advised that your passport must have at least six months validity left on it when you arrive back into Australia. Visa application forms and all relevant documentation are due in our office 75 days prior to departure. Passports will be returned with your final documentation 2-3 weeks prior to your tour's scheduled departure with Wendy Wu Tours. If you require your passport to be returned earlier, a \$15AUD courier fee will apply. INSURANCE

We strongly encourage all customers to take a copy of their travel insurance documents (especially relevant international contact numbers) with them while on tour. We advise that you check the inclusions and procedures for lodging claims prior to your departure. These documents should be stored separately from the originals.

GRATUITIES

Tipping while on holiday is common in most parts of the world and China is no exception. We will recommend an appropriate tipping amount in your final documents.

ACCOMMODATION

Your accommodation is selected for convenience of location, comfort or character, and can range from a business hotel in one city to a family run guesthouse in a smaller town. In more remote areas, accommodation may be of a lower standard and may not have all western amenities. Please note that there is no international classification system for hotels and differences in facilities and quality do exist between the Australia and China. All our tour hotels have private western bathroom facilities, air conditioning, TV and telephone. Plumbing and electricity supplies can be erratic and quite often the power in hotel rooms is turned off while guests are out of the room. If you experience any difficulty, please speak to your Local Guide. Rest assure that all hotels used by Wendy Wu Tours are regularly inspected by our staff and our partners to ensure that standards meet your needs.

Four and five star hotels are also available on private tours. If you would like to upgrade, please speak to one of our reservation consultants.

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

Chinese cuisine is one of the most influential, diverse and flavoursome culinary styles in the world with a legacy stretching back thousands of years. Often you'll find that the local Chinese style is very different from what you're used to at home. DEVELOPMENT IN CHINA




CHINA PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Golden Week public holidays fall annually between 1st – 3rd May and 1st – 7th October
