Corcovado National Park - Corcovado National Park in Costa Rica is a pristine rainforest sanctuary located on the Osa Peninsula, often hailed as one of the most biologically intense places on Earth. Home to jaguars, tapirs, scarlet macaws, and all four of Costa Rica's monkey species, it offers an unforgettable experience for wildlife lovers and adventurous alike.

Day 2: Explore Corcovado

Meals: B, L, D

Today you will enjoy a full day hiking tour of Corcovado National Park.

Take an enchanting journey into the heart of the rainforest, where the dense canopy filters the sunlight. As you follow the winding trails, you will encounter vibrant wildlife, from howler monkeys to exotic birds and the possibility of spotting elusive creatures like jaguars and sloths.

**Day 3: Snorkeling tour of Isla del Cano**

Meals: B, L, D

Today entails a day of snorkeling at Isla del Cano, a small island and biological reserve, boasting one of the most extensive and healthiest coral formations in Costa Rica.

As you dip beneath the surface, you'll discover a world of colourful coral reefs teeming with exotic fish, sea turtles and an array of other marine species.

Isla del Caño - A biological reserve island off the Osa Peninsula in Costa Rica, Isla del Caño is known for its rich marine life and archaeological significance. The island offers excellent snorkeling and diving opportunities, with clear waters, coral reefs, and diverse underwater species, including sharks, turtles and rays.
