ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrive Marmaris

Meals: D

Today you will fly from Istanbul to Dalaman and transfer to Marmaris to board your 7 night gulet cruise.

Spend the night docked in Marmaris Harbour or a nearby cove.



Destination Information

Gulet - A traditional Turkish wooden sailing boat, characterised by its two or three masts and designed for comfortable cruising.

Day 2: Ekincik Bay

Meals: B, L, D

After a hearty breakfast, we set our course for Ekincik Bay. Here you have the afternoon to enjoy at your leisure.

The night will be spent in the Bay, and dinner will be served on the boat.



Destination Information

Ekincik Bay - A peaceful hideaway on Turkey's Turquoise Coast, Ekincik Bay offers crystal-clear waters, pine-covered hills and great snorkeling. It's also the gateway to the Dalyan Delta and Iztuzu Beach, home to loggerhead turtles.

Meals: B, L, D



Day 3: Sunken Bath - Red Island

We begin the day with a stop at the Sunken Bath and savor the historic charm of this location.

Next, we set our course for Tersane Island, where you can explore the remnants of ancient Greek settlements, the shipyard it was named after, and the watchtower.

We anchor for the evening and enjoy dinner on the boat at Kızılada, known as Lagusa in ancient Greek times.



Destination Information

Sunken Baths- The area is known for the ancient ruins of a historical bath, believed to have been built for Cleopatra during the ancient Lycian period. There are also traces of a Byzantine-era monastery underwater in the area.


Tersane Island - The largest island in the Gulf of Fethiye, Tersane is known for its sheltered coves, crystal waters, and fascinating ruins from the Byzantine and Ottoman eras.

Day 4: Fethiye Meals: B, L, D

In the early hours, we set sail for Fethiye.

Here, you may join an optional tour to discover the region.

Or if you prefer you may spend the day at leisure exploring the area, why not visit Fethiye's traditional Tuesday bazaar and savor some of the fresh fruits grown in this beautiful climate?



Otherwise, there is always the option to stay on the boat, have lunch and enjoy the cool waters in Samanlık Bay.

Spend the night docked at Fethiye port, and if you wish take a pleasant walk along the seaside promenade.

Destination Information

Fethiye - Set on Turkey's Turquoise Coast, Fethiye is a lively harbour town framed by mountains and ancient Lycian ruins. Famous for its vibrant marina, bustling markets and nearby Ölüdeniz Lagoon, it's the perfect blend of history, culture and seaside charm.

Day 5: Göcek Island - Yassıca Islands

After breakfast, we head to Göcek Islands.

While navigating these stunning natural wonders, we anchor at Yassıca Islands within the gulf. Lunch is served in these beautiful mini-archipelagos. We recommend trying activities like swimming and diving in these crystal-clear waters.

For the evening and dinner, we set our course for Göcek, famous for making Göcek port.



Destination Information

Yassıca Islands - A cluster of small, uninhabited islets in the Gulf of Fethiye, the Yassıca Islands are known for their clear waters, sandy beaches, and natural lagoons—an idyllic spot for swimming and relaxation.

Göcek - A chic marina town on Turkey's Turquoise Coast, Göcek is famed for its stunning bays, luxury yachts, and relaxed Mediterranean charm—making it the perfect gateway to island-hopping adventures.

Day 6: Port of Aga

After breakfast, we reach a stunning cove named Bedri Rahmi Bay.

Later, we set our course for Sarsala Bay and then after lunch we arrive at the Port of Aga.

If you wish, you can reach the ancient city of Lydai (Khydai/Klydai) by following a path starting from the beach for 30-40 minutes.



The night is spent in this charming port, and dinner is served onboard.

Destination Information

Bedri Rahmi Bay - Originally known as Taşyaka, this cove started being referred to as Bedri Rahmi Cove after the famous painter and poet Bedri Rahmi Eyüboğlu visited the beautiful area in 1974 and created his famous fish-shaped artwork on a rock.

Sarsala Bay - The Sarsala pier was built for grain shipments from the Dalaman and Ortaca plains to Egypt in its time. The remnants of the old pier and customs building can still be observed.

Lydai - The ruins of Lydai reveal remnants of city walls, tombs, and temples dating back to Lycian times—offering a peaceful glimpse into Turkey's ancient past.



Day 7: Kumlubük Bay - Paradise Island

Meals: B, L

After breakfast, we head towards Kumlubük Bay.

On arrival explore nearby caves, discover the ancient cities of Amos and Hisarburnu or take a swim to cool off. Lunch is served here.

Later, we anchor at Paradise Island for afternoon tea and your last opportunity for a swim.

At the end of the day, return to Marmaris Harbor around

16:00. Guests who wish to do can explore Marmaris and enjoy its nightlife.

Please note: Dinner will not be served on the boat this evening.



Destination Information

Amos & Hisarburnu - Perched on a scenic cliff above the sea, the ancient city of Amos invites exploration of its theatre, temples, and city walls, while nearby Hisarburnu offers stunning coastal views and a tranquil spot to soak in the Mediterranean scenery.

Paradise Island - A secluded gem in the Gulf of Fethiye, Paradise Island is famous for its crystalclear waters, sandy beaches, and the intriguing Nimara Cave, which was used by people from the Paleolithic era to the Bronze Age.

Day 8: Fly to Istanbul

Meals: B

Today you will be transferred to Dalaman airport for your return flight to Istanbul. Here your arrangements with Wendy Wu Tours end.
