However, should you wish to dine in any of the speciality restaurants not included in your cruising / "more at sea" package, you will be required to pay for these locally. In addition, if you opt to dine off the ship, these meals will also be paid for locally, and please note you will not be refunded for meals missed on board. Excursions are also available to book with your cruise reservation at your own expense. Gratuities on board the ship are included in your cost.

JOINING YOUR TOUR:

The tour is 21 days in duration including international flights. Join the tour on Day 2 in Mauritius and end the tour on Day 20 in Capetown.

For travellers that have booked a 'Land & Cruise Only' tour with no international flights, please note the price includes your arrival/departure airport transfers if you are arriving on the start and departing on the conclusion date of your tour, or when booking pre/post night accommodation with Wendy Wu Tours.

'Mauritius, Madagascar & the Western Cape' is rated as a **physical level 1** tour. A reasonable level of fitness is required, and you should expect to be on your feet for much of the day. You will be getting on and off coaches, trains or boats and walking around the sights, often including steps, plus occasional longer walks.

- You will be required to get on and off small boats without assistance
- You will be required to board the cruise ship without assistance and get on and off at ports if you wish to disembark the ship



Day 17: Discover Cape Town


Enjoy breakfast at your hotel before embarking on a guided tour of the 'Mother City' with your English-speaking guide.

Take a drive through the city centre and make a stop at the historical Greenmarket Square before heading to the 17th century Castle of Good Hope.

You will also visit the Company's Garden and discover the Bo-Kaap area of Cape Town. Formerly known as the Malay Quarter, this picturesque corner of Cape Town is well-

known for its vast collection of colourful houses and cobblestone streets.







Continue on to pay a visit to Table Mountain (weather dependent), a flat-topped mountain overlooking the city of Cape Town, with spectacular views of the Lions Head and Signal Hill on the left, the City Bowl in the middle and Devils Peak on the right.

This evening enjoy dinner at Victoria & Alfred Waterfront.

Destination Information

Castle of Good Hope – Made up of 9 boutique museums, the Castle of Good Hope was once an Army base, former seat of government as well as a slave port and is now deemed a National Heritage Site. The castle is considered the oldest remaining colonial building in South Africa, a symbol of the country's complex colonial past.

Table Mountain – An iconic natural wonder standing proudly at over 1,000 meters (3,281 feet) above sea level, the flat-topped mountain offers breathtaking panoramic views of the city, the surrounding coastline, and the majestic Atlantic Ocean.

Victoria & Alfred Waterfront – A beautiful neighbourhood situated within the oldest working harbours in the southern hemisphere and home to a retail district, dining, leisure and entertainment facilities, the V&A Waterfront makes for a perfect place to visit for both tourists and locals alike.

Day 18: Cape Town (Winelands)

After breakfast, meet your English-speaking guide and transfer to the Winelands.

The experience starts with an exciting Wine Blending. You will receive a selection of blending components with the challenge to create your own blend. A wine Ambassador will guide you through the process showing how and why certain varieties harmonise better than others.

Then we head to another wine farm in the Franschhoek valley. Here you will enjoy your lunch followed by a wine and chocolate pairing tasting.

Afterwards, journey back to Cape Town and spend the remainder of your evening at leisure.

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Destination Information

Cape Winelands – Comprising of the Stellenbosch, Franschhoek and Paarl Valleys, the Cape Winelands feature some of South Africa's oldest towns and are considered by many as the wine and food hotspots. Each town also features influences from Dutch architecture, with colonial history dating back to the 17th century.

Day 19: Cape Town (Peninsula)

Depart early for your tour of the Peninsula. You will head South and weather permitting, drive via Chapman's Peak. The famous Chapman's Peak Drive is a nine-kilometre coastal road on the Cape Peninsula, south of Cape Town.

Afterwards you will head to the Cape of Good Hope. The Cape of Good Hope is a rocky headland on the Atlantic Coast of the Cape Peninsula. Cape Point may not quite be the southernmost point of Africa, but it will still make you feel as if you were standing on the edge of the world.

On the way back to Cape Town you will stop at the penguin colony at Boulders Beach.

Chapman's Peak - Chapman's Peak is a spectacular coastal road and mountain pass offering breathtaking views of the Atlantic Ocean, rugged cliffs, and the picturesque coastline. The drive is renowned for its stunning scenery and unforgettable panoramic vistas.

Boulders Beach – Famous for its adorable colony of African penguins. The beach's picturesque setting, with granite boulders and clear waters, makes it a serene spot to relax and observe the penguins in their natural habitat.

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TRAVEL INFORMATION

VISAS:

Mauritius

Australian passport holders can stay in Mauritius visa-free for up to 60 days. A border official will stamp your passport on arrival to indicate the end date of your permitted stay. You must provide proof of onward or return travel and complete the "Mauritius All-in-One Travel Form" online before arrival, presenting the printed form with a QR code upon entry. Your passport must be valid for the duration of your stay and have at least one blank page. https://safemauritius.govmu.org/

Réunion

Australian passport holders do not require a visa to visit Réunion for tourism or business stays of up to 90 days. Your passport must be valid for at least three months after your intended departure date.

Madagascar

Australian passport holders can visit Madagascar for up to 15 days without a visa. Upon arrival, you must pay an administration fee per person (fee payable locally and not included) and provide proof of onward or return travel. Your passport must be valid for at least six months beyond your return date and have at least two blank pages.

South Africa

For stays of up to 90 days, Australian passport holders do not need a visa to enter South Africa. Your passport must be valid for at least 30 days after your departure and contain at least two blank pages.

INSURANCE:

It is a condition of booking with us that you take out suitable travel insurance. You must provide us with the name of your insurer, policy number and their 24-hour emergency contact number when you book with us or as soon as possible thereafter. These details will be available to your National Escorts should they be required. Wendy Wu Tours will not be liable for any costs incurred by you due to your failure to take out suitable travel insurance from the date of booking.



Cruise dining: Please note, there are no set menus onboard the cruise ship, instead, you will have the opportunity to dine at your choice of main restaurant included in your package and have the option to upgrade your package whilst onboard to dine in the various speciality restaurants. Your package also includes soft drinks and alcoholic beverages whilst onboard your cruise.

In South Africa: The local cuisine is a celebration of cultural diversity, blending indigenous, European, Asian, and African influences. Signature dishes include the braai, a communal barbecue feast, and bobotie, a spiced meat dish with Cape Malay roots. Biltong and droëwors provide delicious snacking options, while regional favourites like bunny chow and pap and wors highlight the country's culinary variety. Seafood is abundant along the coasts, and South Africa's wine regions, such as Stellenbosch, pair local cuisine with world-class vintages. Restaurants range from fine dining establishments in cities like Cape Town to casual continental cafés, offering something for every palate.

In Mauritius: The local cuisine reflects the island's blend of Indian, African, Chinese, and French traditions. Staples include curries, biryanis, and rougaille, alongside street food favourites like dholl puri and gateaux piments. Fresh seafood is central, with dishes like vindaye and bol renversé showcasing the island's creativity. Mauritius also boasts a thriving rum culture, with sugarcane-based rums complementing its culinary offerings. From bustling street markets to elegant beachside restaurants, dining in Mauritius is a celebration of flavour and culture.

ACCOMMODATION PRE AND POST CRUISE:

All group tour hotels have private western bathroom facilities, TV, and a telephone. Electricity supplies can be erratic and quite often the power in hotel rooms is turned off while guests are out of the room. If you experience any difficulty, please speak to your Local Guide or National Escorts.

Your accommodation has been selected for convenience of location, comfort, or character, and can range from a business hotel in one city to a family-run guesthouse in a smaller town or a heritage-type hotel. Hotels are generally rated as local three to four-star standard but do please note that there is no international classification system for hotels and differences in facilities and quality do exist between Australia and other countries abroad. Rest assured that all hotels used by Wendy Wu Tours are regularly inspected by our staff and our partners to ensure that standards are met. Please be aware that there are security measures carried out at all hotels, on guests and vehicles entering the properties.



Please be aware that porterage is not included on our tours in pre & post cruise. You will therefore need to be able to handle your own luggage within the hotel and when using transportation like trains and coaches.

Porterage is included onboard the Norwegian Sun Cruise Ship. When embarking, your luggage will be delivered to your room from the check-in area at the port. When disembarking you will leave your luggage outside your cabin door on the last night of your cruise. Staff will then be able to make arrangements for your luggage, ready for disembarkation early next morning. Please also note, it is customary to tip for the porterage service.

TRANSPORT:

Coaches: Coaches with air conditioning are used on our group tours for city sightseeing, short excursions to the countryside, and longer transfers where necessary. In South Africa, roads have generally improved in recent years, but traffic congestion, particularly in urban areas, can extend driving times. Similarly, in Mauritius, roads are well-maintained, but traffic in urban and tourist hotspots can be an issue, especially during peak hours. It may not always be possible to return to your hotel after sightseeing to freshen up before dinner, so flexibility is advised. Timings for transfers and tours are approximate and subject to weather and traffic conditions.

Public Transport: In South Africa, public transport is not well-developed. Municipal bus services are limited to cities and operate on a restricted schedule, often stopping early in the evening and offering even less frequent service on weekends and public holidays. Public transport in South Africa is not generally recommended for tourists. Mauritius offers public buses that are affordable but less frequent, with routes that may not cover all tourist areas conveniently. While functional, they may not meet the expectations of those accustomed to highly efficient systems.

Taxis: In South Africa, metered taxis are available mainly in cities but are relatively expensive and must be pre-booked as they cannot be hailed on the street. Minibus taxis are cheaper but are often overcrowded and have a higher accident rate, making them less suitable for tourists. In Mauritius, taxis are widely available in cities and near tourist areas, though fares are often not metered. It is advisable to agree on a fare before starting your journey. Taxis in both destinations can offer safe and convenient transport options when used wisely.

CRUISE ACCOMODATION AND CABINS

At the time of booking, subject to availability you may have the choice to book from an outside cabin or balcony cabin. Should you wish to upgrade to a suite or have a special request for cabin location, please speak to our reservations department who will be able to assist.

CRUISE EMBARKATION & DISEMBARKATION:

Embarkation time is when you should arrive at the cruise terminal. Departure time is when your ship sets sail.

We strongly recommend guests complete their Online Check-In at least four days prior to sailing. Guests who have completed their Online Check-In should arrive at the terminal no later than one hour prior to the scheduled embarkation time printed on your cruise documents.

Please note: guests who have not filled out their Online Check-In must arrive at the port two hours prior.

Boarding Time in Ports of Call: In all ports of call, it is also the guest's responsibility to be back onboard the ship no later than one hour prior to the ship's scheduled departure time. Please be aware that shipboard time may differ from the time in the port of call and it is the guest's responsibility to follow the shipboard time. In the event a guest misses the ship, it will be the guest's responsibility to pay all expenses incurred to rejoin the ship.



APPROPRIATE DRESS:

When traveling to South Africa and Mauritius, particularly in their warm and sunny climates, it's advisable to pack light, comfortable clothing made from cotton or other breathable materials in light colours to stay cool. Long-sleeved shirts and trousers are useful for protection against the sun and insects. A lightweight waterproof jacket is a good idea for unexpected rain, especially in Mauritius during its summer months.

A sturdy pair of trainers or hiking shoes is essential for exploring South Africa's diverse terrains and Mauritius' lush landscapes. For sun protection, pack a wide-brimmed hat, sunscreen, and sunglasses. Coastal areas in Mauritius are warm year-round, so swimwear and light beachwear are must-haves, but remember to dress modestly when visiting religious or cultural sites.

Bring a camera to capture the stunning landscapes and cultural experiences, along with chargers and spare memory cards. A lightweight flashlight can be handy for navigating in low-light conditions. Packing a small medical kit with first aid essentials and personal medications is recommended.

Onboard Dress Code: On Norwegian Cruise, you can wear what you are comfortable with. Go cruise casual or get all-decked out and look your best – it's up to you.

WEATHER:

South Africa's summer runs from November to March, with cooler months from May to August. Coastal regions, like Durban on the east coast, enjoy mild winters and hot, humid summers, while the west coast experiences cooler, drier conditions moderated by the cold Benguela current. Inland regions, elevated on a plateau, maintain uniform temperatures, with highs occasionally exceeding 32°C in summer.

Mauritius enjoys a tropical climate year-round. Summers, from November to April, are hot and humid with occasional tropical rains, while winters, from May to October, bring cooler, drier weather. Coastal areas are warmer than the central plateau, which is slightly cooler and wetter.

Both destinations offer diverse weather, ensuring pleasant conditions for exploration and relaxation.



Most of our groups pre & post cruise consist of 10 travellers or more and will be accompanied by National Escorts. There will usually be no more than 28 travellers in each group although you may encounter other Wendy Wu tour groups while you are travelling.

All our departures are guaranteed to operate with a minimum of 10 travellers booked (unless cancelled due to factors beyond our control). National Escorts will accompany each group of 10 or more. However, at our discretion we may operate departures with a smaller group size as we try to operate advertised departures wherever it is viable to do so. For groups with fewer than 10 travellers, departures will operate with local guides only.

TIPPING / GRATUTIES

Pre & Post cruise:

Although tipping is not mandatory in Mauritius and South Africa, it is highly welcomed and necessary for some workers to make a living, as the wages are often quite low within the hospitality and tourism sector. Tipping costs are not included in your tour and are a good way to show your appreciation for the service you receive, including to your guides and drivers.

Recommended total tipping for tour \$15 Euros per person

Bars & Restaurants: A 10% tip over the total amount of the bill is expected when no service charges have been included.

Porterage: EUR2-5 per piece of luggage

South Africa:

Recommended total tipping for tour 750 ZAR per person

Bars & Restaurants: A 10% tip over the total amount of the bill is expected when no service charges have been included.

Taxis: We recommend using the Uber app as this is a safe and cheap way to travel in Cape Town. If you'd prefer a taxi, please ask the hotel or restaurant staff to call a taxi for you. It is not recommended to hail a taxi along the roadside.

Porterage: ZAR20 per piece of luggage.

On the cruise:

Onboard gratuities are included in your tour cost. Additional tips for exceptional service or services you choose to partake in, are at your discretion.



We want to be able to give you an opportunity to buy souvenirs, so we include some stops at museums or exhibitions which demonstrate a craft or product unique to that region with pieces available to buy. We understand that souvenir hunting is not for everyone, so we aim to take you to places, which hold local interest. We trust you will enjoy these opportunities to learn about local arts and crafts and understand their historical and cultural importance.

LUGGAGE:

All travellers are limited to two items of luggage each: a suitcase with a maximum weight of 20kg and one piece of hand luggage with a maximum weight of five kilograms. It is essential that your luggage is lockable.

On your cruise: While luggage allowance on your cruise may permit further capacity, we ask you to adhere to the above restrictions due to airline and touring allowances. Suitcases should be tagged, luggage tags can be downloaded and printed from your eDocs. For your convenience, we recommend that your luggage tags be placed on your bags prior to arrival at the port.

It may take a few hours after embarkation for your luggage to be delivered to your stateroom. Likewise, suitcases are collected on the last night of your cruise. To avoid any complications, be sure to bring a small bag such as a backpack for carrying any necessary medication, valuables, important documents and need-to-have items.

VACCINATIONS AND YOUR HEALTH:

We recommend that you contact either your GP or Travelvax (1300 360 164) for advice on vaccinations and travel health. Travelvax has a comprehensive website that you may also find useful www.travelvax.com.au.

BEFORE YOU LEAVE:

We strongly recommend registering your travel plans with www.smartraveller.gov.au as in the event of an emergency, Australian Consular assistance will be more readily available. You can also access the Australian Government's travel advisory service for up to date information about your destination on the same website.



AFTER YOUR BOOKING:

Once you have booked with Wendy Wu Tours, you will receive an email with your confirmation invoice, along with a link to our website where you can find your visa information (if applicable) and other important information. Your final documentation pack will be sent to you approximately 2 weeks prior to departure.

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
