ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrive Taipei

Meals: None

Make your way to Taiwan's capital, Taipei, where you will be met by a driver and transferred to your hotel.

**Destination Information**

Taipei – Taipei has an interesting blend of Chinese culture with a fusion of Japanese, Southeast Asian and American influences. The city is a modern metropolis and is known for its lively street-food scene and many night markets.

Day 2: Taipei

Meals: B

Your guide will meet you at your hotel this morning to commence a full-day tour by public transport. Start with a visit to the Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall, a monument dedicated to the former leader, housing two of his Cadillacs, personal documents and artefacts from his daily life.

Next, take the high-speed elevator to the observation deck on the 89th floor of Taipei 101 for a breathtaking bird's-eye view over this spectacular city. Later, explore the National Palace Museum to admire one of the world's finest collections of Chinese imperial treasures and artefacts (closed on Monday's).



Finish the day browsing the sights, sounds and flavours of a vibrant local night market before returning to your hotel.

Destination Information

CKS Memorial Hall – The CKS Memorial Hall is a national monument erected in memory of the authoritarian leader Chiang Kai-shek, former President of the Republic of China.

Taipei 101 – Taipei's skyline is crowned by the iconic 509m-tall, Taipei 101 skyscraper. From its opening in 2004 until 2010 it was classified as the world's tallest building.

National Palace Museum - The National Palace Museum has a permanent collection of nearly 700,000 pieces of ancient Chinese imperial artefacts and artworks, making it the world's largest and arguably finest collection of Chinese art. The collection covers 5,000 years of China's historical and artistic achievements and includes treasures in painting, calligraphy, bronzes, lacquerware, ceramics, jade and religious objects.

Day 3: Depart Taipei
