**Ushuaia-** Where the Andes meets the Beagle Channel, Ushuaia is the southernmost city in the world. Originally inhabited by the indigenous Yámana people, it later became a remote outpost for missionaries and a penal colony in the early 20th century, giving rise to its nickname, “the End of the World.” Today, Ushuaia serves as a vibrant gateway to both Patagonia and Antarctica.

### Day 2: Ushuaia

Today you will embark on a tour of Tierra del Fuego National Park, located only 11km from Ushuaia.

You'll journey through untouched landscapes filled with breathtaking scenery, while discovering the region's unique ecosystem, diverse geography, and captivating history.

**Tierra del Fuego National Park** - Tierra del Fuego National Park was established in 1960 to protect the unique ecosystems and landscapes of this remote region at the edge of the world. The Park is a spectacular blend of mountains, forests, rivers, and coastline and offers a chance to hike scenic trails, spot native wildlife and experience the raw, untouched beauty of Patagonia.
